Meeting Summary – December 05, 2007

President Holland discussed the Executive Board meeting that had reviewed the Club by-laws and proposed some changes to them. The changes are mostly to bring the club by-laws in line with more reasonable spending limits. In addition, with the Club growing in membership, the revised by-laws could add another Representative-at-Large if approved. The proposed by-laws will be mailed to all the members and will be voted on at the February 6th Club Meeting.

Carl Kresge has repaired the steps at Target 9 and was thanked by the Club. In other range repairs, a load of rock was approved for the area between the containers and, if possible, could be brought in before the rains make the road impassible.

The Club members discussed the annual club banquet. The general feeling was that a holiday banquet was not very popular and usually poorly attended. It was moved, seconded and passed to alter the Club Banquet to a Club Bar-B-Q picnic and fun shoot during the Memorial Day weekend. Further details will be worked out between now and the Club Bar-B-Q.

Meeting Summary - January 8, 2008 Round Table Pizza – Lafayette

President Holland encouraged all the club members to participate in the Children's Hospital Benefit shoot at the Bowrack on January 27th. This shoot is for a very worthy cause and all the proceeds go to help the young patients at Children's Hospital in Oakland. President Holland also led a discussion of the work to revise the Club by-laws. The Club directed the secretary to send a copy of the proposed by-laws to each club member. The by-laws will be voted on at the next Club meeting – Wednesday, February 6th at Round Table Pizza in Lafayette at 7:00 pm. Club members asked about the status of the Briones Park passes. EBRP has cashed the check paying for the parking passes, but the club has not yet received them in the mail.

The format of the 2008 tournaments to be hosted by the Briones Archers will also be discussed at the February meeting. The results of the Bear Creek Open last September were disappointing. The club barely broke even with expenses for this shoot. At the February meeting the Club needs to settle on the type of shoot – marked or unmarked yardage, paper shoot, novelty-type targets; format – North American Big Game, African, etc; and also settle firmly on the date for the shoot. Plans need to be firmly set now for the advertising and notices to be accurate.

The Briones Archers also decided to support the Sonoma Bowmen to host the 3-D leg of the Regional Round Robin Tournament at Rancho Neblina this year. The Sonoma Bowmen's range was badly damaged in the flooding of last year. Hosting this tournament will help them get on their feet again.

Planning is also needed for the Monday Night 3-D shoots that will begin in mid-April. A new cook is needed to replace John. Help will be needed as always to set up and take down the course. Please give of your time by volunteering to help.

Ken Messer encouraged Club members to volunteer for another worthwhile activity. Volunteers are needed for the IBO hands-on Youth archery training booth at the International Sportsman's Expo January 10th, 11th and 12th. Volunteers will help young people shoot a bow for the first time and become interested in our sport. This is a great way to give some safe training in our sport and help start some excitement in the next generation of archers. In addition, volunteers will receive a free pass to the International Sportsman's Exposition for the day they work at the booth.

Frank Novak was present as a guest and was voted in as a Provisional Member. Welcome Frank!

Briones Archers Give the Competition Chills at Cabin Fever Shoot – January 20th

One of the most convenient shoots for Briones is the popular Cabin Fever Shoot hosted by San Francisco Archers at their range in Pacifica. This range is also one of the prettiest in our region. However, January weather right on the coast can lead to one of the coldest shoots you'll ever want to compete in. This past Sunday, many Briones Archers took advantage of the opportunity to freeze out the competition and to shoot at SF Archers Cabin Fever shoot. The weather was damp and very cold, with high humidity and a heat-sapping breeze; but the shooting of our Club Members was unaffected by the shivering of the contestants!

Eleven Club members donned their parkas and mukluks to compete in the shot. Fur hats were common on the course and gloves were in high demand! SF Archers set up a course of 30 3-D targets with three arrows shot on each shooting lane. Most lanes had only one target 3-D animal. But some lanes had two animals and others had three. The archers had to follow specific rules on the multi-animal lanes. On lanes with two animals, all three arrows had to hit just one animal in order to score. On lanes with three animals, only one arrow per animal was the rule. This set-up led to some very challenging shooting! Using their skills, and drawing heat from the depths of their mukluks, the Briones Archers showed the competition how it is done! Here's how the club members fared:
