



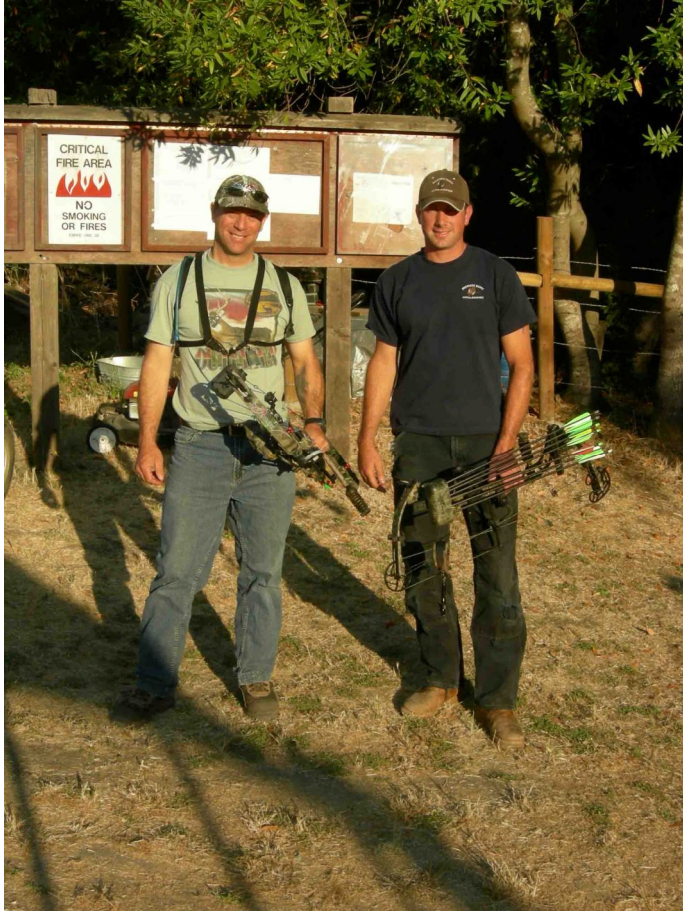

Membership Meeting, August 6

The club meeting was held at Round Table Pizza in Lafayette. Frank Tinley opened and conducted the meeting until Andrea arrived from working late. The primary topic of discussion was the upcoming Monday Night 3-D Finale for 2008. Frank reported that he thought the trophies would arrive on time. John Erickson reported that he was making preparations to provide a free tri-tip dinner for approximately 90 people at the final Monday night shoot. The menu will be: tri-tip, salad, corn, beans and pound cake with toppings. John will do the heavy lifting of cooking and slicing and Bob Springsteen, Jill and Stan volunteered to assist him.

The Treasurer's report showed that we have accumulated enough money to order needed new 3-D animals for next year. The Executive Board will begin looking at replacement animals. Are there any suggestions? Also, the Park has been slow to get parking passes to new members. However, some have recently begun to arrive by mail at the homes of the archers.

The targets for the September Big Game Open are being prepared. The target committee expects to have the prints of the target ready and all that will remain to be done is gluing them on to the cardboard.

A work party and club shoot was planned for the upcoming weekend – August 9th and 10th.

The Secretary will be sending out Membership Renewal letters soon. To avoid unnecessary bookkeeping, those who have become members in the last few months will be considered paid for the new year.

Andrea reported that the 3-D leg of the Regional Championship is scheduled at San Francisco Archers, Pacifica for October. Details will follow. Also, the contract negotiations with the East Bay Regional Park District for the Club's special use agreement are getting underway. The club negotiators are Andrea and John Erickson and they asked for our patience until they are completed. Talk of the range sparked discussion about the possibility of fencing off more of the range to make it safer.
